Instrukcja dla ucznia

Zanim przystąpisz do rozwiązywania testu, przeczytaj uważnie poniższą instrukcję.

Teenagers do not always think like adults, even though they look like adults. On the one hand, teenagers want all of the rights and privileges of being an adult without any of the responsibilities that go with those rights. From a parent's point of view, this is one of the single most annoying characteristics of teenagers.

Here are the seven most common mistakes that parents make in the "letting go" process of their teenagers:

1. _____ Parents of 8- to 12-year-olds are scared to death of the next five to 10 years so they overcompensate by giving their children a quick fix of parental guidance ahead of time. All the sex education that should have been accomplished gradually during the last several years is suddenly thrown at the youngsters, or the parents suddenly want to have long discussions about drugs. This simply doesn't work.
2. _____ Letting go can be a very difficult and agonizing process. You know your child's weaknesses better than anyone else. In addition, you know how perilous the outside world can be and how unprepared children are to make their way in it. And parents of daughters probably have more to worry about, given the pervasiveness of crimes against women. Although it may sound overly simplistic, the best defense is a good offense: raising children to be self-reliant, capable of thinking on their own, resourceful. Children with inner strengths are far more resistant to stress and to peer pressure.
3. _____ Just because much of your child's adolescence has already been predetermined by her childhood doesn't mean that you can fold your tent. Your teenager still requires a lot of parental support, guidance and discipline. But it will be harder now because your teenager will never admit that you're right and she's wrong. But letting go too soon can be just as devastating to your teenager as not letting go soon enough.
4. _____ Snooping around your teenager's bedroom, "accidentally" eavesdropping on phone conversations, and reading a secret diary are all common parental behaviors that are fraught with hazard. Yes, you want to know what is happening in her life; and no, she won't always be willing to volunteer much information. Your teenager's desire for privacy may seem excessive, but respecting this need demonstrates your respect for your teenager's having a life of her own.
5. _____ You can't afford to have an identity crisis at the same time as your teenager. Be assured that if your teenager chooses to look like a slob, it reflects on no one else. Consequently it's the teen's problem, not yours.
6. _____ Teenagers aren't the only ones subjected to peer pressure. Adults are notoriously susceptible to it. Don't ever let your teen talk you into or out of something simply because "everyone else is doing it."
7. _____ Particularly when things go wrong, it's easy to blame your teenager's peers. But the peer group is analogous to a hypnotist – it can't make your child do anything that's fundamentally against his will. If you've raised him properly up until age 12, it's unlikely that the peer group will be able to overcome that influence, no matter how powerful it is. In addition, it's even more likely that your child will select a peer group that shares many of his own values in the first place.

My Dear Brother,
