During the mid-20th century, Hollywood continued to capture the splendour of New York City, with productions such as "Breakfast at Tiffany's" in 1961 and "West Side Story", which brought the city's Upper West Side to life. Memorable lines, like "I'm walkin' here!" from "Midnight Cowboy" in 1969, became synonymous with the bustling streets of New York. As the decades progressed, films like "Saturday Night Fever" in 1977 and '80s hits such as "Ghostbusters," "Coming to America," and "Wall Street" further immortalized the essence of the Big Apple on the silver screen.

Contemporary New York

In the 21st century, New York continues to captivate filmmakers, serving as a central backdrop for various genres. Recent comedies like "How to Lose a Guy in 10 Days," "Trainwreck," and "Isn't It Romantic" prominently feature the city's urban landscape. Additionally, contemporary superhero blockbusters, including those in the X-Men and Avengers series, frequently depict New York as a key setting, with the Spider-Man franchise focusing on neighbourhoods like Queens to offer a diverse portrayal of the city beyond Manhattan's glitz. Other titles such as "Watchmen," "Hellboy," and "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles" further explore life in New York, suggesting a recurring theme of the city being a prime target for supervillains.

Not only popular films but also those highly acclaimed ones do often choose New York as their setting. The following Oscar contenders such as "Black Swan", "The Wolf of Wall Street", and "The Big Short" are prime examples of this trend. Additionally, some of the recipients of major Academy Awards have showcased New York in their narratives. Films like "Birdman" and "Green Book", both of which won Best Picture, featured scenes set in New York. Although "Joker", which earned the Best Actor Oscar, is primarily set in the fictional Gotham City, many of its scenes were filmed on the streets of New York City.
